Remembrance Sunday - 13 November 2022



Councillor Ed Willmot laid a Poppy Wreath on the War Memorial on behalf of the Parish Council and Ashover Parish following an emotional and heartfelt service in All Saints Church led by the Reverend Dr Peter Bold when the Choir sang and Ashover Brass Band played.

Ashover Parish Council displayed poppies around the parish to mark the Remembrance.

On the 11 November 2022 19 people met at the memorial for the crashed Blenheim bomber off an Ashover footpath at Highashes to mark Armistice Day and remembered the three killed in 1943.

Four years ago, at the centenary marking the end of WW1, Ashover Tree Group was encouraged by the Parish Council to come up with a fitting tribute to commemorate those who lost their lives in the 1914 – 1918 war.

In response, the tree group planted 3 beech trees in separate locations overlooking the village. This 'Centenary Triangle' of trees is located in Milltown (Holestone), Uppertown (Wirestone Lane) and just outside the Fabric boundary. Our recently taken picture shows one of the trees which is flourishing in its Fabric location.

On Sunday December 4th the parish of Ashover gathered outside the Basset Rooms, singing carols with Ashover Brass Band and the Choir, to observe the parish tree bursting into light, and most importantly, the children had the opportunity to meet a very special person!

Ashover Parish Council once again organised the annual lighting of the Parish Christmas Tree. The tradition of the switch-on of the lights began in 2006, when Prince Charles visited and carried out the first official 'Switch-On'. Since then, apart from a pandemic stopping us in our tracks, your Parish Council has been organising this special event every year.

This year the tree was even bigger and better, and thanks once again goes to Ashover Community Medical Centre Ltd. for the generous grant towards the event. Thanks to our wonderful volunteers, each and every child got to spend time with our perfect Father Christmas in the beautiful and incredibly atmospheric grotto and told him what they wanted to

open on Christmas morning; and of course the jokes kept coming from our fabulous Town Crier.

Thanks, this year also goes to our new Rector Revd Dr Peter Bold, who along with the children, pressed the big button to bring Christmas to the Parish.

A huge thanks goes out to all the volunteers, who gave their time to set up the event, without all those people it would not be possible.



At the December Parish Council Meeting, Members co-opted Jim Daykin onto the council to fill the vacancy left by Helen Boffy. Members and the Clerk look forward to working with Councillor Daykin, who will be attending Councillor Training in January 2023.

Speed Indicator Devices (SIDS)

Ashover Parish Council has been successful in obtaining a grant towards the provision of two SIDs at Kelstedge. An Object in the Highway (OITH) Licence is being applied for and, if successful, quotes from suitable contractors will be considered by Parish Council Members.

A632 and the River Amber

Ashover Parish Council arranged a public meeting, held in September 2022, with Lee Rowley MP, Councillor Barry Lewis, Leader of Derbyshire County Council and representatives from Derbyshire County Council Highways, Severn Trent Water and the Police.

As a consequence Lee Rowley MP arranged a site meeting at the Ashover sewage works with Ashover Parish Council Members, Severn Trent representatives and residents to seek further information on discharge rates etc. It's anticipated that further information and possible proposals will become available once Lee has corresponded with Severn Trent. County Councillor Barry Lewis has reported that further safety measures are proposed for the A632 and the provision of speed cameras is being investigated.

Update on 'JIM'S FIELD', Alton

News from the Alton Community Land Group:-

Since the last communication a great deal has been achieved in getting the field into shape to become a wildlife haven. A lot more detail on what has been done can be seen on our website at: https://altoncommunityland.wordpress.com/

This can also be reached using your smart phone to access the QR Code at the bottom of this note. Some highlights are:

The Great Wall of Alton - Graham Jones (a skilled dry stone waller) and Chris Fewtrell first surveyed the walls on Jim's Field on 12th November 2020 - establishing priorities for rebuilding. In December 2020 wall building commenced with David Brailsford delivering a stone gate post to form the pedestrian entrance on Quarry Lane. After the East wall along Quarry Lane was completed the North wall was started from the East end and the section up to the Riding School Building was completed in September 2022.



Out of the 240 metres of wall Alton Community Land are responsible for, some 100 metres have now been rebuilt by Graham Jones (foreman and tutor), John Camp, Mike Howells and Chris Fewtrell. The emphasis now shifts to maintenance.

Finances - In May we asked whether anyone wished to financially support the work of the charity and thanks to a small number of very generous donations by Friends we now have about £800 to help the charity survive into the future.
